### Ordinary Women Achieve Something Extraordinary!

Monday evening 23 March was just another graduation event... or was it? Who was graduating? Five women from Mary Andrews College, each with their Diploma of Theology...

What is extraordinary about these women is that they have chosen to devote a few years to study the Bible – amidst the busyness of life with families, children, aging parents, church ministries and outside church ministries and work.

This year Mary Andrews College's five graduates are all married women in the 'middle years' of life - not normally a time for women to take on the rigours of theological study. *"I prayed eight years ago that God would teach me all that he wanted me to learn. That he would sort out all the extras: husband, four kids, work, house and ministry. He did... I discovered MAC!"* (Annette)

Dr Karin Sowada, CEO of the Anglican Deaconess Institution Sydney Limited (the parent body of MAC), gave the occasional address. Karin gave us a helpful snapshot of what Sydney's current and future women will look like and cast a vision and challenge for Mary Andrews College. *"In a highly competitive education marketplace, we must work harder and smarter to be the theological college of choice for women who don't want degree based education but who want to develop their ministry skills in a flexible learning environment."*

## New Subjects Offered in semester 2

There will be fifteen subjects starting at Mary Andrews College in late July to early August. See below for descriptions of two subjects which are new in 2009.

### Spiritual Formation

'Spirituality' is the buzz-word of personal transformation in our culture. Examine what the Bible says about Christian spirituality, and tackle its common forms in our society, such as meditation, solitude, fasting, journaling and asceticism. How do corporate activities like public worship, accountability, encouragement and community life enable us to grow in our Christian character?

## Opportunities in Myanmar



On 19 May Jackie, Chris and Lyn boarded a plane bound for Myanmar. We had been invited over for the 95th Anniversary of the Mother's Union in Myanmar. 500 women from all over the country gathered for this special celebration. Some had travelled for a week to get there by boat, train, bus or on foot. We shared in Bible study with these women each morning.



Myanmar is a beautiful country with wonderful people, but life is very difficult. Only 5% of the population is Christian and being a Christian brings many challenges for them.



We were also able to take up the opportunity to share God's word in a number of other locations. Overall we had the opportunity to share with about 800 women. There is a real hunger for God's word and for training in practical skills. With the help of translators, we taught from the books of Colossians and Ruth. We also covered issues such

as understanding the grieving process, training in 'Two Ways To Live', and a number of talks on various aspects of the Christian life. The Anglican Deaconess Institution funded the Burmese version of the 'Two Ways to Live' booklet, so that the women have material to share when they get opportunities. Below is a picture of them holding this booklet.



Another very special experience occurred on the one year anniversary of Cyclone Nargis, which had devastated the Delta area and Yangon. There were many people at this particular gathering that had lost loved ones, had their homes destroyed and were still struggling to cope. We formed a special circle of about 100 women and prayed together. The faith of these women is truly inspirational.



We were able to see some of the children that we have been supporting over the last year and again had the opportunity to encourage them through God's word.



Our trip was made possible by funding from the "Work Outside the Diocese" Committee.

We are hoping that Mary Andrews College can continue to support and develop this work. For Jackie, Chris and Lyn it has been a challenge to see that we have so many resources in the west. In Australia we don't fully realise the difference we can make in the lives and ministries of our Christian sisters overseas. ## How is MAC Going?

It is now nearly 18 months since the historic decision was made for Mary Andrews College to hand over the degree theological education side of its ministry fully to Moore Theological College. The Anglican Deaconess Institution Sydney Limited (ADISL) contributes significantly to the funding of the female faculty at Moore College. Mary Andrews College no longer participates in the training of these women at Moore College. Instead we are continuing our focus on the training of lay women through the Diploma course, short courses and the annual weekend conference. We are continuing to offer subjects at centres around the Diocese and are developing this work to cater for a wider group of women. For example, in the near future we are hoping to have our first Indigenous Diploma subject offered as an intensive. We also plan to address the needs of working women who need extremely flexible modes of study. We hope to encourage women who are associated with our Diploma course to join short-term missions overseas.

*“If Christianity, and our particular brand of reformed evangelicalism, is to have any continuing appeal in our post-Christian society where we are engaged in reaching, amongst others, educated and working and non-working women, then we must reflect the world around us as far as we are able, within our own theological constraints.”*
